<b>Vision and Intent</b>	<p>At The Griffin Primary School we aim for all our pupils to develop a life-long love of music, in a school with a musical atmosphere, through a wide range of quality musical experiences which engage and inspire them. We aim for our children to have creativity, curiosity and excitement about music, as well as for them to develop increased self-confidence, self-esteem and collaborative skills. We aim to build a curriculum which inspires children to love music with a progressive pathway for every child. Music opportunities will support children’s mental health and allow them time to express their emotions. Children will perform, listen and analyse critically, sing, improvise and compose music and understand the musical elements as building blocks within music.</p>

It has had taught elements and been available as continuous provision. It has been inclusive for all learners.</li> <li>• Music is seen as an integral part of early development. <b>Musical experiences</b>		Inspire our pupils to love music	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Singing takes place at least twice weekly in whole school assemblies.</li> <li>• All children are involved in a production at Christmas – this is a musical production.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Children to be taught Christmas Carols to sing around the Christmas Tree on the penultimate day of the Autumn Term, with parents/carers and families also invited.</li> <li>• Work more closely with Lawrence Sheriff music department to inspire our pupils – performances in assemblies – staff/students/ensembles</li> <li>• Each half term, listen to music from different decades as children enter assemblies – introduce them to different musicians/genres (eg. classical/jazz/pop/folk/country) and from different countries/cultures.</li> </ul>
<b>Our future plan for music at The Griffin Primary School</b>				
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Introduce peripatetic music lessons from Year 2.</li> <li>• Introduce whole class music ensemble lessons in Year 3.</li> <li>• Establish a school choir and take part in events such as ‘The Big Sing’ and Warwickshire events.</li> <li>• Research and invest in music tech appropriate for the different age groups of pupils – eg. playxlyo.com ; garageband.</li> <li>• Consider sharing PPA cover between MFL and music as the school grows, working alongside Lawrence Sheriff School.</li> <li>• Invest in instruments as the school grows.</li> <li>• Stage a ‘proms’ style event where all children who learn an instrument perform to parents (once our first cohort reach Year 5).</li> <li>• Introduce a production each term as the school grows – Autumn = EYFS &amp; KS1 ; Spring = Lower Key Stage 2 ; Summer = Upper Key Stage 2.</li> <li>• Participate in activities provided by The Heart of England Music Hub/Warwickshire Music Education Hub</li> </ul>				

## Music and Inclusion

We are committed to ensuring that all pupils have the opportunity to participate in music lessons and to explore music further (eg. through learning an instrument with peripatetic teachers, joining the singing club or instrumental ensembles) as the school grows.

### **Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)**

No child will be excluded from learning instruments, singing opportunities, visits outside of school or participating in performances due to an additional need. Support and adaptations will be put in place to enable all children to enjoy the full range of musical experience

### **Pupil Premium (PPG) Entitlement**

Children who receive free school meals and wish to learn an instrument or belong to a club/ensemble through our extra-curricular offer will be eligible to apply for financial support to pay for lessons and/or rent an instrument. Through the Warwickshire Music Education Hub, qualifying pupils will receive 50% remission on individual/group tuition, and paid Warwickshire music ensembles. Subject to availability, qualifying pupils can apply for extended free hire for one instrument for the duration of their period of study. Parents/career will need to comply with the terms of hire and where applicable, students will be expected to attend a music group.
